Ag green roof open house: Karen Midden, one of the main organizers of the ag green roof project, will be hosting an open house of the green roof. Students who wish to attend should go to the ag building. The green roof can be accessed via white stairs on the exterior of the ag building near the ag green house.

Green Tour: The tour will feature sustainable sites and initiatives here on campus.
