<u>Carbondale designated bike-friendly community</u> - This week, the League of American Bicyclists named Carbondale a Bicycle Friendly Community at the Bronze level, a designation that recognizes the city's ongoing commitment to enhancing safety for bicyclists.

<u>Protection Of Native Bees And Other Pollinators On Sites Within The Illinois Nature Preserves System</u> - This paper covers multiple concerns over honey bee and native bee interactions along with information on the loss of native pollinators to assist and guide management considerations for sites protected within the Illinois Nature Preserves System.

<u>Free Online Course will Focus on Energy Issues</u> - "students will gain the knowledge and the tools not only to reduce their carbon footprint, but also to help others understand and act on the issue."

<u>Franklin Energy 2017 Scholarship Now Open for Applications</u> – Applicants must be current undergraduates entering their junior or senior year who are enrolled in full-time study at an accredited four-year college or university with a declared major in engineering or environmental science. Natural Heritage Graduate Student Residency Program - The Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) and the Illinois Nature Preserves Commission (INPC) will have eight Graduate Student Intern positions with an expected start date of January 3, 2017. Those selected for these internships (residencies) will be funded employees of the IDNR for 12 consecutive months. These <u>field-based residencies</u> provide graduate students with practical hands-on experience working with an IDNR Natural Heritage Biologist or INPC Natural Areas Protection Specialist. Duties include monitoring endangered species, conducting biological inventories, and managing Illinois Natural Areas. Training in the application of prescribed fire and herbicide is included.
